I have been receiving some feedback about things here at First Lutheran. As I mentioned in my last article, we always need to be asking, õWhy do we do what we do and is it working?ö As part of that, there have been some minor adjustments to various things. No major changes, but some adjustments. Let me list a few things that have been adjusted and some ides that have been tossed around and may be introduced.



Confirmation has been modified to be driven by the confirmands through guided questions from myself,

Pastor Chad and the mentors. Pastor Chadí who is that? That is a good question. Pastor Chad is a full-time Middle School teacher in South Sioux, but he is also the pastor at Faith Lutheran in Maskell. He has only one confirmation student and it happens to be his son. Because of that, he asked if he could be part of confirmation here. This benefits his son and the entire confirmation class.

I have given permission for the confirmation students to text me their sermon notes, so be prepared to see a phone out during service. Speaking of phones, I encourage all of you to have your phone out and post pictures and let people know where you are, and invite them to come.

As you might know, the confirmation students are acolytes. With that, you may have noticed a couple of changes to that. First, I have asked them to only carry one candle lighter and the other will carry the cross. I donot want to be serving a congregation where the acolyte or the church catches on fire. Second, you may have noticed at the second service, they no longer wear robes. I do not, so I suggested to them they did not have to either.

If you have not noticed, I like to have the kids in service. As part of that, I encourage all the children and their families to sit in the first three rows of the sanctuary. I want the future of our congregation up front, actively engaged in the worship. Noise of children can be a distraction, but the noise is not noise but LIFE! I have found that children in worship will learn how to interact appropriately in service, if given the opportunity, and if they are not bored but engaged in the service.

This year we had the congregation put ornaments up on the tree, during

worship service. Since this has not happened yet, I hope it went/goes well. This is part of being engaged in worship, the Holy Spirit and with each other.

Before the children¢s program on Wednesday, December 21, there will be a dinner. Then following the children¢s program, we will do a Christmas sing-along. We will have some of the favorites, such as Frosty the Snowman, Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer and others. After those, we will be encouraged to call out Christmas hymns from our hymnal and they will be played and we can all sing along.

If you have ideas for this congregation and want to lead those ideas, please come see me. If you would like to participate in leading parts of worship, come see me. If there is anything you would like to be part of, come see me.

Here is a little preview of things to come:

First communion classes. This will be for parents and children and will run four weeks long. More information to come.

Adult Catechism classes. Did you not get an opportunity to be confirmed? Did you miss out on confirmation classes? Did you forget some of what you learned in confirmation? Well, then, this class will be for you. Look for more information to come.

New Member class. We have had people indicate that they would like to officially become members of this congregation. We will have a one evening class about that and then install you as a member of this congregation. More information will be coming.

As we walk though Advent, looking for the birth of Jesus Christ, Lord, I ask that you send your Holy Spirit to each and every one of us. Kindle in us a flame that gets things stirring here at First Lutheran. Father, in you all things can be done, so put the inspiration to carry out our hopes and dreams, not only for First Lutheran, but the community and beyond. Give us the desire and the words to tell all that we encounter just what Jesus can be in their life, and invite them to come to First Lutheran to be in a wonderful welcoming community of believers.
