I am grateful for all that I have experienced and learned here. I can tell that God is still calling me to be your

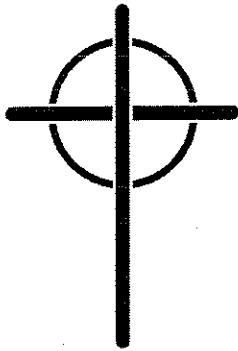

pastor. I am excited to continue being your pastor for the foreseeable future. How long is that? Only the Father knows the date and time. I have received no email, letters, visions or anything else from God to indicate that God's call for you and me to be together had any particular expiration date.



First Lutheran is such a great place and will continue to be a place of mission and ministry for the entire community. Our Social Ministry team continues to reach out to the community. First Lutheran was featured on KMEG (14) and FOX (44) on December 20 for the ministries that involve Haven House. I say to you, we are not here by accident. Would we be missed if we were not here? You're darn tooting we would be! We have so much of a positive impact in this area. Often people would rather speak of the negatives; maybe it is because it seems "more sensational". Actually, what is done in the name of Jesus Christ and through the Power of God is what is really SENSATIONAL!

What is really sensational is that God uses the ordinary, or at least by worldly standards, to accomplish the extra ordinary. A trickster, a man who failed in his faith of God to provide him offspring, who wrestled with God, becomes the father of a nation (Jacob/Israel). A slave and a murderer led the Jews from Egypt (Moses). A drunkard becomes part of God's plan to start the world over again (Noah). A man considered the lowest of lows, who collects taxes for the Romans, is made a disciple/apostle (Matthew). A fisherman who consistently doubts, and denies Jesus three times, is the first bishop of the church (Peter). A follower of Jesus, a woman who stays by Jesus' side, even in crucifixion, and is one of the first to see him as the risen Christ, becomes known as the First Apostle (Mary Magdalene). A young woman, who is nothing special in the eyes of anyone but God, carries God into the world in her womb (Mary, mother of Jesus).

If all of these ordinary and worldly suspect characters can be used by God, called by God to do something spectacular, so can each of us. The spectacular, not human made, but through God's intervention. It is through the power of God. For in God all things are possible. In God, we will continue to be God's people, flawed and called, into the world, for the sake of the world in the name of Jesus the Christ, Son of God.

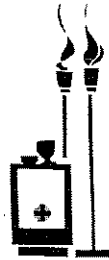

► January Flower Chart

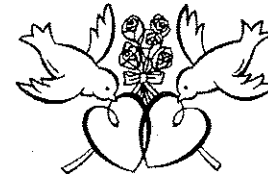

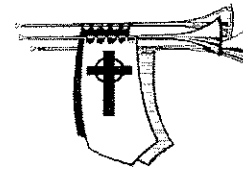

Siouxland Food Bank ◀

Thursday, December 7, 74 households received 2,933 pounds of food. One hundred fifty-eight adults and 113 children live in those homes. Forty-eight households resid in Nebraska, 25 in Iowa and one in South Dakota.

Thursday, December 21, 68 households (46 from Nebraska, 21 from Iowa and one from South Dakota) received 3,594 pounds of food. There were 134 adults and 109 children in those households.

Thanks to all the volunteers who give their time in helping with this worthwhile project, sorting, and handing out the food items with a smiling face.

► The Gift That Will Keep on Giving

As you read this, the holiday season has just ended. We had LOTS going on during this time—a sing along and soup supper, the children’s program and musical performances, and three services on Christmas Eve—blended, contemporary and traditional.

The final week of the year was “Christmas” on the church calendar. And with it the final baptism service of 2017. According to the church calendar, we’re now going to celebrate the Baptism of our Lord on January 7 and then we start Epiphany.

But is Christmas truly over? Yes, the gift giving is over for the season—but sometimes gifts can keep on giving year after year.

We are blessed with many talented folks who work hard to put on a contemporary service each week, as well as the choir, bell choir, children’s singing and, of course, the traditional service. The one thing that must work each and every time it’s called on is the sound system.

And our sound system has been malfunctioning far too often. Much of it was purchased in the 1980’s and late ’70’s and at best is obsolete. Fortunately, we’ve received a gift that we hope will keep on giving! One of our members donated enough money to replace the main system amplifier that we believe is the main source of our current problem. By the time you read this, the amplifier should be installed and being used in worship.

It’s not the only problem with our very outdated electronics, but it’s the most immediate one—and I thank the member who came forward with the donation!

I hope each of you had a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year; the Spirit Connection Band is looking forward to playing for you—come and worship with us!

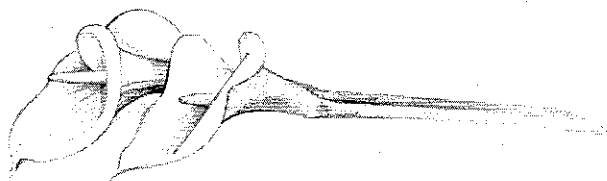

WEDDING AND ANNIVERSARY RECEPTIONS

A donation to the First Lutheran Church Women of the E.L.C.A. is requested as follows, based on attendance:

1 – 50	\$75.00	151 - 200	\$ 105.00
51 – 100	\$85.00	201 – 250	\$ 115.00
101 – 150	\$95.00	251 – 300	\$ 125.00

If food other than cake, punch, coffee, nuts and mints are served, there is an additional charge of \$25.00. If sandwiches are to be made, the meat and cheese should be sliced or the filling prepared by the family.

FUNERALS:

Church members will help at funerals by providing and serving cake and/or salads and coffee. The family will pay for any additional food; it is customary to make a donation to the Women of the Church.

Non-member funerals will be charged the same as for weddings. Only cake and coffee will be served unless there is a special request for additional food provided by the family.

OTHER:

Anyone using the church kitchen for a non-church related activity requires:

1. Checking with the church office for availability and fees.
2. A 30-day notice to enlist First Lutheran Women to serve activities, other than funerals.
3. First Lutheran Church to be reimbursed the cost of kitchen supplies used for fundraisers.
4. The presence of a Woman of the E.L.C.A. for use of kitchen appliances and/or contents (i.e. dishes, pans, silverware, punchbowls, etc.)
5. Dishwasher use requires a Woman of the Church who has had formal training; an additional fee will be applicable based on the time required, with a minimum fee of \$25.
