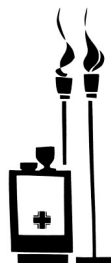

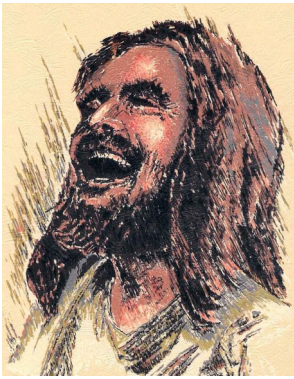

Membership vs. Discipleship

So often congregations get fixated upon keeping up or growing membership. Membership does not equate to donations, which, if we face it, is why congregations look towards membership. Donations pay for the expenses of doing ministry. Sometimes expenses pay for others to do what volunteers will not do. I have a friend who has a congregation that worships over 300 each weekend. Other than the band, the paid staff is a part-time secretary and a part-time custodian. The rest are disciples doing the missions of the congregation, so others can do mission and outreach. "A church that continually reminds its disciples that service begins at home and in the workplace, as we strive to build healthy relationships, seek reconciliation, resolve conflicts, and simply care for the people closest to us is also more likely to attract more people into structured programs of service." (Power Surge, Michael W. Foss)

In mid-October I will be starting a sermon series on discipleship, which will wrap up in time for Advent. Speaking of Advent, look in the newsletter for a preview on that. Anyway, discipleship churches grow because those disciples are committed to responding to God and will come and do. Some of you may have already stopped reading, but to those who have continued, let me give you a preview of the sermon series. By the way, some may stop when you hear what the marks (identifiers) are, of those that are committed disciples of Jesus Christ.

The sermon series is based upon a book written by ELCA pastor Michael W. Foss, "Power Surge: Six Marks of Discipleship for a Changing Church." This is the same book that the church council has been reading and will be discussing as central to the council retreat in September. As I mentioned, marks or identifiers for the person seeking discipleship, that they are headed in the right direction, committed to following Jesus Christ. Here are the six marks:

1. Bible Study
2. Prayer
3. Worship
4. Christian Service
5. Giving (Stewardship/Tithing/Donation of time and talents)
6. Living in Grace

Each of these are not as you can or as you desire, nor can you simply say, "It's not my thing". They are done regularly, consistently and not out of obligation but out of response to God. "It is the long experience of the Christian church that walking humbly with God-which practicing the marks of discipleship assists-is the surest way of justice and kindness." (Power Surge, Michael W. Foss)

There will be a signup sheet for books under the welcome center TV for those who want to walk in discipleship of our Lord Jesus Christ and follow along deeper than these sermons will be able to take you. The Word of God will guide you in your walk in His name.

Points or Miles?

Some people use particular credit cards because they get points to use towards discounts on purchases or free stuff. Some get cash back. Others have options that give them miles towards free airline tickets. Do you have those options on your credit card? Here is a way to maximize them.

When you give to First Lutheran, do so electronically and set up recurring giving, using your favorite credit card. This way you get the points, cash or miles and First Lutheran can count on a regular flow of cash to do ministry.

But it costs to use credit cards. Yes, there is a small fee for First Lutheran to accept credit cards. However, the upside is the ability to count on the cash flow for ministry. You will get full credit for your donation. We do not pass the fees along. This is just like our previous electronic giving. If you don't want to use a credit card, then set up recurring giving with your checking or savings, which has a slightly lower fee for First Lutheran.

How can you set this up? Head to <http://donate.flcsc.org>. Set up your account and start getting your points, cash or mileage. You can also head to the Apple Store or the Google Play Store and download the EasyTithe app for your phone or tablet. Then set up your account.

Lastly, if you read my article from the August newsletter, you will recall the article on Passion. When you give electronically, you can easily give towards something you may be passionate for. You can give to the general fund, but you can also give to many other funds. If you do not see one you want, let the office know, and it likely can be setup.

Maximize your points, cash and miles while maximizing ministry at First Lutheran. That is a great way of practicing stewardship.

Lower Cost, Higher Speed and Updates

You may have noticed by now that our phone system has changed. Why would that be the case? We are constantly trying to find ways to lower costs and keep or expand what can be offered here. Let me explain to you what we had and what we have now and how much it is saving.

We had a very old Lucent Technology phone system. For those that do not know, Lucent Technologies was established in September of 1996, from portions of AT&T, Western Electric and Bell Labs. The idea was to provide telephone service equipment to telephone service providers. In 2006, over 10 years ago, the company was taken over by a French company and the company and technologies they produced have become non-existent.

The Lucent phone system was designed to offer extensions to different offices, voicemail and a variety of other features. However, we were not utilizing any of those features. To find someone that could work on the system and to get parts would have been very costly. The phone system become an impediment, a boondoggle and a liability.

Today, what do we have? I began a conversation with Long Lines, our telephone and service provider, to look at solutions that could benefit the congregation, lower costs and offer more features. When you call the main line, 402-494-5461, you are now presented with an auto attendant. I know some do not like these and if you press 6 on your phone, you will be taken directly to the office phones that will ring. The other options listed are: to hear a menu in Spanish, to get food pantry hours, Food Bank hours, Worship times with Sunday school time, and office hours. Most of the phone calls that Kerri takes are for these items. This will allow her more time to work on other important items in the office.

What else changed? Now when a voicemail is left, it is sent via email to Kerri and me. This means we will know when there is a voicemail. For me, this means even after hours, I will get those voicemails. In addition to all this, we increased our internet speed from 2 mb x 10 mb to 10 mb x 100 mb. So what, you might be saying. Faster download speeds mean that more work can get done without the wait on the internet. Faster uploads mean a better-quality streaming service, for those that have taken advantage of this option. Which, if you check our stats on attendance, many are taking advantage of, both at the 8:15 and 10:30 services.

All this must be costing us more money? Actually, it is not. We have eliminated the possibility of significant down time and costs associated with the antiquated Lucent system failing. We no longer are paying taxes on the phone bill, which had been \$8.05 a month. We still have to pay

surcharges. Our monthly phone bill goes down \$19.05 a month. A total savings of \$27.10 each month, for a yearly savings of \$325.20 a year.

One final note. Our outbound calls you receive from the office may look different. Our outbound number is 402-494-5462. For those with Caller ID, it will show as First Lutheran but with this phone number. We have had that phone number all along as a rollover number, if the lines were busy. Also to note, our fax number is also that number.

Scrip

Please consider supporting our youth in ordering Scrip cards.

Scrip is a way of purchasing gift cards for common items like gasoline and restaurants. It is not limited to just those; many other options are available. This costs you nothing but what you would spend already.

First Lutheran will get a percentage of what is purchased. That in turn will be put towards youth events.

There is a book in the entryway with all the vendors available. Orders are taken the first Sunday of the month.

Cards will normally be available the following Sunday.
