

## First Call Retreat/Godly Play Pastor Doug

In September, I attended a retreat for first call pastors. I attended because I am still in the first three years of my ordination, October 17, 2015, which happens to be the day after my first day coming to First Lutheran, October 16, 2016. Anyway, as I digress, I am also aware that many may not realize that there is ongoing training for first call pastors.

During these retreats (which this is the last one I will be attending) we are given all sorts of good insights through targeted training. The bishop attended this retreat and gave us tips, pointers, and fielded questions about worship practices. It was refreshing to hear from someone who has a gift for worship. Bishop Maas loves to participate and plan worship, although he does not get to as much as he would like, not being in a parish setting anymore.

I also was introduced to a different way of teaching our biblical stories. These can be taught year after year, to children, adults, older adults, etc. In other words, Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Confirmation, Worship, Nursing Homes, and other places with people that are willing to listen. There are all sorts of possibilities, and what is most exciting are the intergenerational possibilities that can be seen.

What is this different way? It is called Godly Play, https://www.godlyplayfoundation.org/ There is training for those that would lead in the teaching of the stories and then there are the materials. The stories can be first taught to the Sunday School and beyond. The idea is to have all the story materials available on hand and tell

our stories from the Bible. Tell the story of creation, Joseph, John the Baptist, parables, Psalms and much more.

From the Godly Play Foundation Website:

**Godly Play** is a creative, imaginative approach to Christian formation and spiritual guidance. **Godly Play** has a Montessori foundation with 40+ years of research and practice.

**Godly Play** values process, openness, discovery, community and relationships.

Godly Play models the worship life, stories, symbols and rituals of Christian congregations. Godly Play allows practitioners to make relevant and personal theological meaning. Godly Play nurtures participants to larger dimensions of belief and faith through wondering and play.

The Godly Play series contains 8 volumes of stories, and there are materials available for each story. It sounds expensive (and it is), but it is something that does not have to be replaced year after year. It is something that can be creatively used over and over.

Can you imagine, our youth will learn the stories hands on and be able to tell the stories to others. Years and years worth of Sunday school and VBS materials that never go out of date. An opportunity to tell the stories to our members and friends in the nursing home. An opportunity for the youth to help tell the stories in the nursing home. A time of telling and sharing in multiple group settings. What a great opportunity to open the doors to faith, through the telling of our biblical stories.

The training is three days long. Currently there is no training in Nebraska, but there are pastors actively working on getting a training to come to Nebraska. There is a training coming up in October in Chicagoland. I have already heard of someone who wants to go.

I encourage you to head out to the Godly Play website to check out the program. Do you want to be a story teller? Let me know, I would love to hear from you. Do you want to help support this program? Let me know, I would love to hear from Ray Schleusener—October 10 you. You can contribute financially to this program, by designated giving to Godly Play. Some of the materials we can make on our own. All we need are people willing to support telling the stories of our Bible and willing to contribute their time to making the props for the stories. If you are interested, take a look at the website and then let me know. I would love to hear from you.

Keeping the biblical stories alive for generations to come.
