

Bridges Pastor Doug

Peace and grace of our Lord be with each of you, my sisters and brothers. As your pastor, it is time to help all sides to come together as one. We have all made mistakes, me included. Forgiveness is for each of us, and because of God's love for us in Christ Jesus, we have the opportunity to start anew with God and with each other.

Now, more than ever, it is time for us to call upon the Holy Spirit to help build bridges. Bridge building can be a monumental task. "The Christian life is not a sprint ... it is a marathon. Training for one is far different from the rigors of preparing for the other" (Emily Schankweiler; A Sacrifice of Praise). Bridge building will not be a sprint but a marathon in getting this done.

When I think of bridge building, I first think of a movie that I really enjoy watching over and over. It involves team building with the enemy. It also involves team building with friends and bringing all together for a common goal. The movie puts groups of unlikely people together, and in doing so, it changes everyone. Will he delay long in helping them? ⁸ I tell you; he will quickly grant justice to them...." In God all things are possible, all we have to do is ask. Jesus says; "Truly, truly, I say to

you, if you ask anything of the Father, he will give it to you in my name."

This congregation is very divided, and we need to be bound together in love, building bridges to each side. It will take everyone's help, with the Holy Spirit, to accomplish this. First and foremost, we need to be in prayer. Not only individual prayer, but in prayer together so we can tear down the walls of "Us" and "Them", until it is "We" in the Holy Spirit. Church Council Minutes

First Lutheran Church - Council Meeting - Sunday, September 29th, 2019

Attendance/Roll Call – Deb Kenny called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m. and presided over the meeting in Chad's absence.

Present: Pastor Doug, Deb Kenny, Sue Hunter,

Trevor Brass, Kathy Anders, Judy Blessing, and Brandon Trautwein.

Unexcused absence: Terry Sorem and Linda Johansen.

Excused absence: Chad Cain.

Acceptance of Agenda – Sue made a motion to accept the Sept. 2019 agenda, Brandon seconded this motion.

Devotion – Martin Luther for September 29

Reading of Vision and Mission Statements

Vision Statement – Building upon the properties that God provides. To reach out in mission to the community.

Mission Statement - Loving others in Christ for outreach to all; while providing for God's diversity.

Guests: Members of the audience were invited to address the church council.

 Kathleen (Kathy) Blair spoke up about her experiences at her previous church home, which she felt are like what occurred at her previous congregation regarding conflict. She expressed concern about the same types of conflict appearing here. Kathy felt that the good that Pastor Doug has done has far outweighed the negatives about him. She was befuddled as to why the conflict existed.

- Bill McLarty spoke to the council regarding the conflict within FLC and the need for compromise. He stated that he signed the petition (to remove Pastor Doug) to help bring in a 3rd party to listen to the conflicting sides at FLC and make recommendations to help save FLC. Bill was concerned that if FLC continues the path it has been on, he is worried it would die as an institution. Bill asked if anyone had sat down and listened to people who had left the church to ask why they had left. Bill was asked by Sue Hunter what he felt this council should do to help heal the conflict, and Bill recommended that each side (congregation, Pastor, Bishop) needed to meet. Bill suggested FLC work out an agreement with a Siouxland-area pastor.
- John Koskovich was asked to speak by
 Deb Kenny as to why he continued to attend FLC despite his disagreements with
 how things are run at FLC. He stated that
 he was emotionally invested in FLC as a
 long-term member and did not want to
 see FLC continue on this path. He said that
 he felt that those who had brought concerns to the church council had been dismissed by a "my way or the highway" attitude. John asked about Pastor Doug
 "going after" individual members of council.
- Mike Hunter asked those in the room who attended the January 2019 congregational budget meeting. He said he pleaded at that time to those who had concerns about FLC's direction and leadership to come to the monthly Church Council meetings. Mike said that he has made a point of attending each church council meeting since then to see if people had come to the council meetings to submit their concerns.
- Lucy Gagnon said that the same people who are causing drama now are the same

people who had created drama under the previous two pastors at FLC. She felt there were personal vendettas being brought under the guise of congregation-wide conflicts. Lucy added it is important that folks contact the church office if they have pastoral care concerns, like being sick in the hospital. Otherwise, it is difficult for Pastor Doug to be aware of which of his congregants need pastoral care.

 Janell Sila said she was sick for 9 months and that she was visited consistently in the hospital, throughout her surgery and recovery, including during Ash Wednesday despite Pastor Doug's demanding schedule during the Easter Season. She expressed gratitude for Pastor Doug's constant contact and pastoral care during this time. Janell stated that if Pastor Doug is removed, she herself will leave FLC.

Minutes from August Council meeting & Executive Meeting - Accepted by Judy's motion, Deb seconded. Executive council meeting minutes are still being prepared by Trevor Brass.

- -August Team Reports Sue's motion to accept, Brandon seconded. Ayes carry it unanimously.
- -Pastor Report from August Pastor to remove duplicate entry. Kathy's motion to accept as amended, Judy's second. Ayes have it unanimously.

Mission Support Financial Reports and Status – Sue Hunter reported to the council: giving is low, monthly budget is \$23,456 / month. Giving is \$12,655 / month. Budgeted money is not necessarily spent for that month. Actual spending is lower than what is budgeted. Sue

Hunter discussed the need to develop next year's budget, but felt this was difficult given the uncertainty regarding the October 20th vote on the Synod's recommendation regarding Pastor Doug's call at FLC.

Judy's motion to accept the August 2019 financial report as written, Kathy seconded. The ayes carried the vote unanimously.
