

Chant

What is chanting? That is good question. Recently the idea of chanting has been used in a negative light by some. Chanting is biblical and is used in multiple religious settings. Defined in the Nelson's New Christian Dictionary, a chant is: Melodic recitation of prose, especially the Psalms. Throughout the Middle Ages the Psalms were chanted in unison to a series of short, plainsong melodies known as tones.

You will note, especially the Psalms. The call and response in music with the Psalms is in itself a chant. Chanting is done by many monks during vespers. In the Lutheran Handbook, Vespers and Compline are spoken about. The daily services of readings and prayer, including Morning Prayer (Matins), Evening Prayer (Vespers), and Night Prayer (Compline). Note that Vespers, Matins and Compline relate to prayer just as chant does.

In Ezekiel, a chant of lamentation is mentioned at the desolation of Egypt.

¹⁵When I make the land of Egypt desolate and when the land is stripped of all that fills it,

when I strike down all who live in it,
then they shall know that I am the LORD.

16This is a lamentation; it shall be chanted.
The women of the nations shall chant it.

Over Egypt and all its hordes they shall chant it,

says the Lord God.

From The Westminster Dictionary of Theological Terms, **plainsong/plain chant** (Lat. *cantus planus*, "unaccompanied song"): An unmeasured, unaccompanied unison vocal melody sung in church during worship. It is often considered to be synonymous with the Gregorian chant and may be called "plain chant."

Where have you heard chants in Lutheran Worship? Most every Sunday you can hear a form of chanting. I choose not to chant because I am not comfortable with my ability, but you still get some of the chant in responses from the congregation. Where? In Kyrie, which finishes by chanting with "The Lord be with you" and the congregation responds with "And also with you." We only use a small portion of the possible chanting in our worship. We currently use setting two of the Lutheran Book of Worship. The prayers are all meant to be chanted. Note, prayers and chant work together.

Chant, Biblical, Liturgical, Lutheran and it is a prayer. Chant away to the Lord.

Acceptance of Agenda – Sue moved to approve, Judy seconded. Ayes carried it, Linda opposed.

New Business

Carpets in hallway, bathrooms and sanctuary have been cleaned – Lee and Carrie Novak did this.

Correspondences received -

Custodian says that the new vacuum works great.

Anonymous said that Pastor Doug saved their life.

Letter from FLC member Nancy Sivill on August 12th, 2019: requested a transfer of membership from FLC, SSC to Hope Lutheran Church, SSC. Her motivation was the ELCA's recent announcement (early August 2019) regarding sanctuary policy for undocumented immigrants.

Her paperwork has already been sent to her new church.

Synod conflict update –

Bishop sent Pastor Doug an email saying that the listening team is currently compiling the data gathered during the listening sessions last week (8.14.2019). Future dates as to when the results will be presented are currently yet to be determined.

Sue Hunter proposed a financial assessment on those who signed the petition to remove Pastor Doug for the costs of responding to the petition. This is estimated for 3 churchwide mailings at about \$300 each (a mailing for *each member* was required.) The ultimate cost, in terms of paperwork and mailing expenses, is currently uncertain.

After discussion, Sue tabled her motion for next month.

Chad Cain made a motion for Kerri the church secretary to record her hours spent on handling matters regarding to the petition to remove Pastor Doug (supplies for mailings to each church member) - with these numbers to be published on an ongoing basis. Judy seconded this motion. Ayes carried the motion; Linda opposed.

Chad Cain made a motion to publish Kerri's hours spent responding to the petition and the physical costs in the church. Sue seconded the motion. Ayes carried the motion, no opposed.

Discuss attendance trends – Pastor Doug reviewed long-term attendance trends dating back to 2007, data which includes the previous two pastors at FLC, Pastors Kelley (2014-2016) and Jer (2006-2014). Trend: uptick until petition to remove Pastor Doug was circulated in May.

Mission Support Financial Reports and Status – Sue Hunter gave her report: Giving for July was down, giving was \$12,364, last month was \$15,000.

Pastor Doug has been in continual contact with the Bishop regarding FLC's finances. The practice of "rolling" FLC's deficit has been a source of continual confusion, but this practice is done by other churches.

Deb motioned to approve the Mission Funds as reported, Judy seconded. Ayes carry the motion unanimously.

2020 Theme Verse

Isaiah 6:8

"Here am I; send me!"

This was proposed by Pastor Doug for the council's consideration and reflection.

Open for other new business -

Pastor Doug: Announced he had registered for TheoCon in Kearney, NE (October 7th through the 9th) for \$200 and has booked his hotel. Will cost

\$515, slightly over the \$500 budgeted.

Prayer Shawl ministry: discomfort with Paula Reider attending in light of J.R. suing the church. A letter to her requesting that she leave the knitting ministry was drafted and read aloud. The letter was modified with council feedback, and signed by Kris Dill and the FLC Council. Sue made a motion to send the letter to Paula Reider, Chad seconded. Ayes carry the motion unanimously.

Rita Todd – Sunday School leadership and teachers are being arranged. Two more teachers will be necessary for Sunday School to be possible: Brianne Lake will be superintendent/instructor, Jenni Durant will also be an instructor. Linda Kendra, Rita Todd, and Deb Kenny have volunteered to teach Sunday school.

Mutual Ministry will be looking for a replacement for Gary Panko.

"God's Work, Our Hands" is coming – Sunday, September 8th – potluck for the congregation and working on Lutheran World Relief.

Fellowship – has accumulated money it has been trying to spend: looking to brighten some lights around the church, starting with the fellowship hall and the lounge. Lee Novak is looking at a price for this. Also, Fellowship is looking at the blinds in the fellowship hall as they are dirty and need to be replaced.

Pastor Doug – looking to replace the current fluorescent lights in the hallway, welcome center, and office with LED strip lights to save energy and bulb replacement costs. Lee Novak to look at costs.

Pastor Doug – has changed the confirmation program, it will no longer be on Wednesday nights. It will now be on *Sunday after the second service*. 8th graders to have their parents as a mentor, whereas 7th graders will need to find a mentor that is not a parent.

No more sermon notes – confirmand will instead attend a service with their mentor and discuss

and then journal.

Confirmands will be required to do service/ volunteer hours, which will be tracked by the mentors.

This system can be run by a supply pastor/call pastor/interim pastor. Pastor Doug is attempting to set-up a smooth transition for FLC in the case that he is asked to leave in the near future as part of the Synod listening process.

Pastor Doug verbally recommended to the church council that they vote "yes" to whatever the Synod listening team recommends to the members of FLC once the team presents its report.

Close in Prayer – Deb's motion to close the meeting, Kathy seconded. Ayes carry it. Chad closed in prayer.

Next church council meeting is: Sunday, September 29th, 2019.

I will not, I cannot allow myself to be used as a club against Pastor Doug.

I will continue for the time being as Chair of the Mutual Ministry Team at least until after the Synod Consultation. So this is my resignation from that team as of August 15. Other than that I will not involve myself in any other activity having to do with leadership at First Lutheran.

I wish you all well as you navigate this sea of conflict. You will be in my prayers and thoughts.

Correspondence

We are at the stage of the process where each individual gets to have their voice heard through a congregational vote. On October 20th we vote to either accept the recommendations of the synod or reject the recommendations of synod. This is a very important vote. I cannot stress that enough. I cannot state how important this vote is for First Lutheran Church. We are either going to be continuing the mission with Pastor Doug as the pastor of this church that God has asked us to do, or we are going to be in a holding pattern of that mission with an unknown time frame on our hands.

Currently we are, as I see it, a train going down the tracks at 90 mph with an engineer that has his hands tied. We are the only ones that can stop it by voting no. If we don't stop it the train is going to crash and burn. We need to vote no on the recommendations if we want to be able to keep the church's decisions and future in our hands. We need to vote no because we have made so many positive strides with our current mission at hand. Our mission of being more community oriented. A mission of taking the Word to the people as Jesus says for us to do. We have done this by doing the positive things such as a Pray Ground, Online streaming, Outdoor services, and a Contemporary Service and opening our doors for more groups to meet

here. I know we have done outdoor services before but Pastor has made it point to make sure the public knows about them by going on KMEG and talking about them. He has also taken on the job of doing all of our social media posts. Another way we have moved towards taking the Gospel to the people.

I love the fact that we have two services to choose from. It gives us the ability to give something for everyone to worship. I love the fact that we have a Pray Ground. I know I have seen plenty of smiling faces from the children in the Pray Ground but also the adults that watch them walk down the aisle every Sunday morning to take their place up front. I love the fact that we have online streaming. If I am having a bad day I can go back and watch Sunday's service. If I can't make it a Sunday due to life happening, I can watch it where I am. I am not the only one that gets a benefit out of the online streaming. We get about 20-30 hits for it either on Sundays or throughout the week. That's how we get to the people. I have seen new faces that enjoy our band at second service. That is amazing. All these things that we are doing and that Pastor Doug is leading us to do, is wonderful for us. We keep doing the right things we are going to continue to grow.

I don't want to give up on what has been accomplished so far. But if we don't have a Pastor that gives us his all, we will be doing a disservice to this congregation, to the children of the church, and the community that we have reached out to. If we don't vote no we will not have a pastor that would able to continue what we are doing now. I am not saying Pastor is the be all, end all, but the reality is we will be having a Supply Pastor that comes in for service on Sunday and then leaves after, if we can even get one to come here. Once we get an interim it will be his way as written in the contract and approved by the synod. We have the Pastor we need to not only get us through this but will be able to continue to grow our ministry into the community.

Pastor Doug and his family are involved with everything that is happening in the church. I love that. I don't want a pastor that shows up on Sundays and leaves right away. I want a Pastor that is personable, that is reliable, and that is always there when you need him. When my grandma was in the hospital and was declining in health quickly, Pastor was there within 10 minutes of my phone call with him. He was there to help console the family, to help me get through it, and prayed with my family and grandma as she was passing. That is a pastor I want to be able say is my pastor and our pastor. How many others have had that happen to them? A loved one or yourself is not in the best of health and Pastor finds out about it his first thing is to call. Then he shows up and is there for you and the loved ones. That is a small sample of what our Pastor does and why we should vote No.

May you find peace as you meditate upon what the Holy Spirit is calling you to do.
