

Parsonage Work and Sewer Smell - May need new wax ring on toilet, this was done last week. New wax ring didn't address the issue. Pastor Doug will call and schedule this service call.

Sacristy Ceiling Damaged - Terry Sorem to fix in fall. Will work on when he's available to do this. This is water damage that is old, at least since 2016.

No update.

South Garage-Update: Terry Sorem has the materials on hand.

Property Repair/Update/Replace

Repair of caulking on floor to ceiling stained glass windows – Still waiting on replacement of lights to use scaffolding in one go.

Replacement of lights in sanctuary that light up Altar – **Quote Obtained from Kevin O'Dell Electric Inc. - in "Quotes" folder.** (\$865 w/o scaffolding rental)

Replacement of incandescent to LED lights outside of choir loft –

Repair/replace tower lights – **Quote Obtained from Kevin O'Dell** (\$1,330 – *includes* bucket truck rate but not cost of repairing landscaping that may be damaged by the bucket truck)

Repair/replace trinity sign on tower -

Repair light on South side of metal FLC sign – **Quote Obtained from Kevin O'Dell** (\$560)

Repair/update lighted sign on Dakota Ave to LFD –

Proposal to make double wide drive on South to Exit only with left and right turn lanes. Drive North of the double wide to be made into entrance only. Signage to indicate same for these locations.

- Chad made a motion for the outside work (the tower lights and the metal FLC sign for \$1,330 and \$560 respectively). Brandon seconded the motion. The ayes carry the motion unanimously. Sue Hunter to contact O'Dell Electric. Decision for the inside work (for the inside lights for \$865) to be tabled for next month.
- o Chad asked Mike Hunter about the painting of the parking lot lines. Mike discussed the planning of the entrance/exit flow to FLC's parking lot.

Nursing Home status

Turn area of drive – supposed to be done before winter, but no visible progress on this part of the project. Additionally, there is concern about the slope of the concrete to the drain, which currently can't drain with the normal flow of gravity. Deb Kenny will follow up on these concerns.

Security Cameras –

One camera to be installed on garage. Need electric junction box to unit for it to function.

Picnic/Food/Band Shelter -

Need to see plan and estimated costs. Boy Scouts may be able to have this as an Eagle project.

Sound cabinet has been modified for new sound board

Need back of cabinet to be made removable.

Pine needs to be stained to match oak wood.

Hinges to be put on back of cabinet.

New Business

Church and parsonage had furnace checks and filters: good by Pastor Doug.

Correspondences received:

- Thank you for Pastor Doug for the Baptism of Britton and Brielle.
- Campus ministry request for \$1,000 for the UNL Lutheran Center. Can be spread out over 2 years: \$500 in 2020 and \$500 in 2021.

Chad made a motion to put this in the budget. The ayes carried the motion unanimously.

- A message to First Lutheran Church's Facebook page by Pat Krontz on September 16th,
 2019 regarding their appreciation for Pastor Doug

Synod conflict update:

What's next? The vote held today was 60 for "yes" and 73 for "no" as to the Synod's recommendations, the result of which is that the recommendations are rejected, and Pastor Doug is to stay. A consultant will need to be brought in, Chad Cain anticipates that Bill Biggs, the Synod attorney, will contact Chad Cain or Pastor Doug regarding this. Deb Kenny mentioned about the need to move forward and for the Council to not gloat about the perceived victory. Pastor Doug said this evidenced a sharp divide in the congregation.

Discuss attendance trends – September trends are 557 showed up on Sundays, this is up from July and August, but down from June. 2 baptisms, 1 death, 1 transfer out. Net of 0 (lost 2, gained 2)

Mission Support Financial Reports and Status – Pastor Doug delivered the treasurer's report. Brandon's motion to accept the treasurer's report, Judy seconded it. They ayes carried the motion.

Open for other new business:

- FLCSSC.org domain to be moved from Pastor Doug's name over to First Lutheran Church's name.
- · Yahoo website that FLC wasn't using has been closed and now is hosted under Bluehost for \$3.95/month.
- Judy asked about the lack of a fire alarm and fire suppression system FLC's building doesn't have this but is grandfathered in due to the age of the building (early 1960s). Also mentioned were Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) FLC doesn't have these. FLC does have several fire extinguishers around the church which are inspected annually.

Deb made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Judy seconded. The ayes carry it, with only Chad Cain opposed.

Church until the 29th of December, fulfilling all expectations through the Christmas Season.


