





# 2020, Now What Pastor Doug

As I write this, our annual meeting has not taken place. I am prayerful and hopeful that as a whole, this congregation will choose to move forward, look to healing the congregation and following God's call. Sometimes it is our personal preferences that blind us to following the call God has for us as a congregation and for us individually.

Pastor Jose had a two-part sermon series about following God's call. It was based upon a book called, *Just Say Yes, Unleashing People for Ministry*. One of the basic pieces of this was that it is not about our preferences, our wants. It is about what God wants for us. It is about what God wants for God's people.

We enter 2020 in a time of uncertainty. Not only for our congregation, but our denomination, all of Christianity in the United States, and, let's face it, a general uncertainty in our country. The church, the body of believers, was/is to gather for worship and in that time of gathering, be insulated, NOT ISOLATED, but insulated by the effects of the outside world. Then they were to be sent back into the world to do mission and ministry. Somehow the outside has continued to creep in and take hold.

From the Isaiah text on January 26<sup>th</sup>, the day of our annual meeting, we are told of something new coming. For us, it is already here. But often I wonder, do we see it? Isaiah 9:1-4 tells us that the people walked in darkness, but now there will be a great light. That the light has shined (hmm much like 2019 Theme Verse, Isaiah 60:1). There will be increased joy.

It is in Jesus that the Kingdom of God has come near. It is in Jesus that we are no longer in the dark, light shines, and there is increased joy. At least there should be. From the same day's readings, Paul wrote to the church in Corinth. There is conflict in this congregation and Paul wants it to stop. He appeals to them in 1 Corinthians 1:10, in the name of Jesus, to be in agreement and united in the same mind and purpose.

I appeal to you, sisters and brothers, in the name of Christ Jesus, for the same. For us to stand united in mind for the purpose of mission in the gospel of Jesus. Just say yes, and follow our 2020 theme verse, Here Am I, Send Me (Isaiah 6:8). This is something that cannot wait. The new testament uses the word immediate (or variations) 69 times. Not later, but now. It is used 14 times in Acts. It is used 27 times in Mark. In Matthew it is used 13 times. There is an importance to the gospel of God's son, Jesus.

We are called to action. Which also means to trust in God's love for us in Jesus. It is stepping out of the boat in faith. The conflicts that have been going on here for over 30 years does not have to end in destruction. Conflict can, in fact, be constructive. We are being called by God for a "reset", not only in our lives, but in the community life of this congregation. We are being called to be transformed. When Jesus called his first disciples, their response was immediate, not delayed.

The person preaching, which is not just the pastor but all disciples, is called to preach the gospel. We are called to preach this at all times and all places. We are called to do this immediately, not delayed to when it might be easier, or a more convenient time. When you preach the gospel, it is not always comfortable. Not only for the preacher, but for the hearer. The call is not only just to preach about morality but to be the proclaimer of an alternative reality than the world of yesterday and today. This will cause conflict. It will stir things up. It will make people uncomfortable. It will be difficult. Jesus said he did not come to be unity but division. Yes, there will be division between those who want to be in the light of the alternate reality and those that want to stay in the darkness they have grown comfortable with. But, in the division, there can be unity through constructive outcomes to the conflict. It takes work. It takes time. It takes leaving our wants behind and letting go for God to work.

Ultimately, we have to continually ask ourself a single question when we disagree with decisions. How does what we want further the mission and ministry of God in the gospel of Jesus Christ? Does the color of the paint, the carpet, placement of an item in the Narthex, in the sanctuary, in the fellowship hall, the type of music, the type of worship, when worship is, and the list can go on, how does that further the mission and ministry of God in the gospel of Jesus Christ?

It is not about us; it is about God. It is about the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit for all of God's people. We are followers of Christ. We are Christians who live in the United States, but ultimately, we are Christians...period. We are blessed to have the freedom to be followers of Christ Jesus and be able to live in His light. We are blessed to be able to live in this new reality, should we choose it. We are blessed to be able to Say Yes, Here Am I, Send Me. (Isaiah 6:8)

That is what I am prayerful that 2020 brings. I am prayerful that is what the annual meeting starts and that we will bring in 2020, living in the alternate reality that Christ offers us.

Peace, and blessings in 2020 and beyond.
