

What is Going On? Pastor Doug

First, we all know the situa-

tion that we have been facing, individually, as families, employers, and employees. As a congregation, we are made up of God's people, who also identify as the aforementioned people. We come from South Sioux City, Sioux City and beyond. We are part of Siouxland, and we are also the people of God.

At the last council meeting, the council chose to keep worshiping in our parking lot, rather than bringing people inside. This decision was not taken lightly. Keeping in mind the seriousness of responsibility towards all of God's people, but most specifically those mentioned in the previous paragraph, weighed into the decision. The need and want to worship together inside, with the ability to ethically provide a safe environment that would not negatively impact others, is what ultimately drove the decision. Today, May 26th, the news reported that three police officers of South Sioux City tested positive for COVID-19. We need to stay safe, and the council recognized that.

What does that mean for the congregation members and guests? The council will reevaluate the situation at its meeting in June. It also means that we continue to provide a meaningful worship experience in our parking lot. We will also continue with our expanded online presence. First Lutheran has been able to carry out our mission even amid the pandemic. We continue to be; "Loving others in Christ for outreach to all; while providing for God's diversity."

How have we increased our mission? We use a product called Vimeo to assist in our streaming

of worship and sermons. This has allowed us to provide a place for people to be involved in worship, through five locations. Three on Facebook, Twitter, Vimeo and YouTube. Prior to Vimeo, during the pandemic, we reached about 800 streams a month. This means that 800 times in a month, someone would click play on the stream. Since the implementation of Vimeo, we now have been reaching over 5,000 streams a month. From May 11-17, we had 1,374 plays of our videos (Worship and Sermons).

At least 65% of people would prefer to watch a sermon in person. Another way to look at that is that 35% of people would prefer to watch a sermon as a video. So, we stream our worship for those that want to watch this way. We also stream because, even if you prefer to watch in person, sometimes you cannot. Did anyone say "pandemic"? What about those that work Sundays? What about people that are sick and confined to a home or nursing home? This is part of God's diversity that we are reaching.

Regular attendees of First Lutheran have noticed many new guests coming to worship. Some have advised they found us streaming and wanted to come in person! Now, before you ask, the answer is I do not know. How many gave? How many want to become a member? Membership really only counts to vote and hold council positions. It is unfortunate that congregations often look at membership to determine success. As for giving, some people give cash and others will give. Look at the offering prayer we have been using during our outdoor worship.
