



Multiple Religions Study Pastor Doug

I am excited that we are back in the church building. Although church has not been closed, it is still good to get back inside. Now that we have been in a couple of weeks, we need to get back to the two most important aspects of being a disciple of Jesus Christ. First, we need to be in prayer. Prayer is the cornerstone to following Christ. It is our conversation with our God, and in that, we can hear the calls we have. The second part is to be in the Bible.

I am proposing we start a study here that looks at other religions and other denominations. How is that Bible study? Well, when we hear what others believe, it will draw us into our Bible to reconcile what we are hearing. It will draw us into the Bible to look deeper to our beliefs. We will need to look to our Bible to be able to respond to what we are learning about other Christian beliefs and about other religions.

We will be using a book titled *Honoring Our Neighbor's Faith* and the ELCA document, "A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment: A policy statement of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America". There is room for 28 people to participate. If there is demand for more, then we will get more books and make multiple groups, depending upon the response.

The study will run on Wednesdays from 6:30-7:30 p.m., starting October 7, 2020. The hope is that we will have this completed by the last Wednesday in November, which is the 25th. There are 32 different areas to cover. Pre-reading is a MUST. We will be covering 4 sections each night. We can also make this availa-

ble via Microsoft Teams, should you want to join the study this way, vs. coming in person. Teams is like using Zoom, Facebook groups and other chat type software. We need you to let us know ASAP if you would like to participate, so we know how many groups to have going. Obviously 28 people in a group is too many, but if we need to, we will break this into 2-3 groups.

You can sign up to let us know you are interested by contacting the office, online or via our app on your smart phone/tablet. It is important to know ahead of time who is interested in joining this study. We need to have enough books and if there are too many online or in person, it will be difficult to have a productive study, allowing for all to have some input.

Please consider, as a disciple of Jesus, learning more about your neighbor's faith and, in the process, learning more about what you believe in.

Can You Say No to God?

You can't say no to God. You can try to hide. You can try to run. You can even deny. However,

when God seeks you, He will stop at nothing until He finds you.

Being raised as a believer, you may wonder why anyone would ever doubt God. He is always good. He knows what is best. Following Him will always be the best decision in life.

I totally agree with this reasoning, but sometimes His leading is in areas that you may not want to go. Maybe He will ask you to leave your good paying job to some unknown adventure with Him. He may ask you to reconcile with someone that has hurt you a lot. Sometimes He asks you to go out into a storm where you think you will die. What if we don't what to do what He asks?

Well, Moses said no to God. Moses is often referred to as God's friend ([Exodus 33:11](#)), but this 'friend of God' flat out said no to Him. God appears to Moses at the burning bush, and they have a long talk. In the end, Moses doesn't want to go because he has a fear of public speaking. At least twice, Moses tells God no. Finally, God relents and creates a compromise to allow for Aaron to be the spokesman for Moses ([Exodus 4:13-16](#)).

Does this mean we can still say no to God? The question is not whether saying no is the right thing to do; the question is really based on whether God will reject us. I mean, if we say no to Him, would He still love us? Can I still be used by Him in other areas? Can I still have a relationship with Him if I say no to one of His requests?

The answer to those questions is, of course, yes. He will not leave you and would never stop loving you if you said no. The reason is simple. His love and His forgiveness are everlasting. If He needs you he will not relent. I am proof of this. I said no to God for years.

I was asked to participate in the Living Last Supper, the Christmas concert, Christmas Eve services, and the Living Nativity in 2019. I had not been back in First Lutheran since I moved away from the area after high school. That was in 1985.

I was warmly welcomed each time. It wasn't until after the Christmas concert that I started feeling the calling to "come home". I kept ignoring that whisper. It was relentless. I tried to ignore it. Yet I found myself watching the live streams from home. I started listening to contemporary Christian music again which I had not done in years. During this time, I kept hearing that voice saying "You're needed. Come Home." I finally gave in and said yes to God. I started with the Praise Band. I wasn't expecting to be asked to be the music director but yet again, that's what I like to call a "God thing".

I realized through prayer and realization that God will always know what is best for us. That being said, He will wait for us to accept His offer. "He is patient with us not wanting any to perish" ([2 Peter 3:9](#)). "It is His kindness that leads us to repentance" ([Romans 2:4](#)). God is way more interested in our hearts than He is our obedience ([Psalm 51:16-17](#)).

Saying no to God seems like an impossible thing for a Christian. But sometimes it is easier to turn off our hearts in obedience than to wrestle with God about things we don't want to do. God prefers the wrestling to the deadness because the wrestling maintains the connection. He loves you completely and doesn't want separation. Christ went to the cross to bring you to God ([1 Peter 3:18](#)).

My advice to you is if there is an area you want to say no to God about, tell Him about it. Tell Him why you are afraid or what you think may happen. Whatever you do, don't allow it to turn off your connection with God. Allow Him to pour in His kindness and love. He loves you for you!!

I was scrolling through Facebook and came across a cartoon-type drawing of Jesus and a small child. The child was clutching a small teddy bear. She is telling Jesus, "But I love it God...." Now with a much larger teddy bear behind Jesus's back, his reply to her is: "Just trust me".

What a reality check! How many times have I clung to the old ways?

Why is it so hard to move out of our comfort zone and embrace change? When did we become so lazy, we lost our sense of the big picture? When did we become so arrogant?

God calls each of us to be disciples of Jesus. That's a scary word, I get it. Maybe you are asking yourself what that really means. What does discipleship look like? God makes that very easy to see.

Reality is when God says step out of your comfort zone, by golly, step out of your comfort zone! So you don't like change? God says, "Wait, change can be good". Think about that image of the little girl and the teddy bear.

In a recent reading from Jonah 3:10-4:11, we hear Jonah is throwing a temper tantrum, you know the kind that a child throws. Jonah doesn't want to do what God is asking, and doesn't like the results he thinks should have happened. However, our God being ever so loving, kind and compassionate, beyond our own comprehension, he tries to help Jonah understand.

God's plan for us is much greater than our own. Whenever we try to control the outcome, what seems perfect, later becomes a disaster. Our resistance to trust God completely leaves us hurt, afraid and maybe even a little lost. We blame God and/or point fingers somewhere else other than at ourselves.

When you stop feeding a plant it dies, right? So, when we stop listening and trusting in GOD, we die, in a sense. We lose joy, happiness, and even security.

Rest assured, God was there before you were born, saw what you would do before it even happened, and is already waiting on the other side, to say, "I Love You, Trust Me." There is no need to worry but only trust. Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me." (John 14:1 NIV)

Sometimes I must stop and ask myself "when did I become bigger than GOD?" Maybe you need to ask yourself that same question.

Gracious Lord, we all call upon you to learn how to trust and have faith that you are in control. Help us to know that you have great plans, and that we are all going to be okay. Help us to let go of our desire to be "right" and feel your presence at work. Help us to understand it won't be easy, but in the end so rewarding. Amen.
