





Welcome in the name of the risen one, Jesus

We have embarked on a great journey. Although we do not yet know what paths God will take us on, we have been given direction by the Holy Spirit, in the name of Jesus, through the Effective Church Group. That journey of new life started on Reformation Day, October 25, 2020. Throughout the coming year (and it will be a new church year as well) we will be guided by the Spirit to embark on taking the steps to be reborn.

As your pastor, I must confess that I have some apprehensions about these changes. Yet at the same time I am very excited and have felt the Holy Spirit present. Being engaged in the entire process is very important. I invite you see the Becoming Engaged, Top 5 on our Website or in the September Newsletter. Everything is in prayer and that is where it must start.

I admit, there may have been some scary stuff I just mentioned above. Change, Holy Spirit, being Re-born, and being engaged. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to be changed, to be reborn and to be engaged in change. It is what we say we do and now it is time to "DO".

When Jesus gave his disciples, you and me, the Great Commission, it called for change and it called upon the Holy Spirit. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. (Mt 28:19–20 NRSV)

Jesus tells Nicodemus, and us, that we must be born again. If that is not scary, I do not know what is. "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴ Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵ Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶ What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit." (Jn 3:3-7 NRSV)

No, I have not gone crazy with all this talk about the Spirit, New Life and being Born Again. It is what we must do. We enter our 101st year of ministry. Ministry and the makeup of the congregation cannot look like it did 50 years ago, nor can it look like it did 100 years ago or even 10 years ago. God does not change, but how we hear God, how the community hears God and how the community responds to God does change.

We as a congregation must find new ways to engage the community where they are. Provide a meaningful way for others to be engaged in mission and ministry. Find a way to be inclusive of all of God's people that allows this congregation to grow in mission and ministry for another 100 years. That means that this congregation will look different tomorrow, but it will also look different 5 years from now.

In Romans, Paul tells us that "...we also should live an entirely new life." (Ro 6:4d WNT)

Our 2021 Theme verse requires that we evangelize, by going and telling others. "Go,"... and tell the people the whole Message of this new life. (Acts 5:20 TCV) We will be known in the community and in the Nebraska Synod as the "Church of Abundant New Life". Who is ready to be part of this? Become engaged at all levels in the congregation and beyond. We are sent, now let's GO! In the name of the one who provides New Life, Jesus.
