PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR PATTI

Greetings and Grace to you all.

We just came through what I often call the longest month of the year (it at least feels like it this year with all the snow activity). And we enter into the shortest month of the year (one day longer this year since it's leap year). But even though it's the shortest month, we have major things to focus on this month.

First...we have the Asset Mapping sessions scheduled for Sunday, February 4 following worship; Saturday, February 10 at 10:00 a.m.; and Sunday, February 11 following worship.

Asset Mapping is all about identifying assets. But the process of this identification includes scripture deep-diving and communication. In our sessions we will look at scripture and let that scripture guide us into conversations about who we are and what we have to offer to the mission of First Lutheran Church. It is important that all voices participate in this project...to identify our mission more clearly, and to identify what each of us might be able to "be" in and for that mission. Please sign up to study and explore together.

All voices are needed...please sign up for one of these sessions. You can either sign up on one of the sheets at the Welcome Desk or you can email me prdmeyer@gmail.com or call me 623/910-7859.

The second thing is that Lent is just around the corner. Ash Wednesday is February 14 already. We will gather that afternoon to begin the Lent season with a tradition of marking ashes and beginning our Lenten spiritual practices. I will have some heart ornaments on a tree in the Welcome Area for you to take home with you that afternoon. Each heart will have a Bible passage marked on it. This can be a Lenten focus passage for you to read as a devotion (daily or weekly) or that you can read as a family throughout your Lenten journey. I also have a scavenger hunt for you to work on throughout the Lenten season and for everyone who turns in a completed scavenger hunt, there will be a surprise for them.

Our focus in scripture for midweek worship will be from the Synod's "Go and for Lent" series. The stories for this series will be

- Week 1: Jesus with the Woman at the Well
- Week 2: Jesus with Zacchaeus
- Week 3: Jesus' story about the Good Samaritan
- Week 4: Observations from the Temple Turning Over the Tables and/or Giving 2 Coins
- Week 5: The Road to Emmaus

And our series for Sunday mornings will be a focus on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. In Peter we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. In Peter, we often see ourselves. By following Peter's

journey, we watch the story of Jesus unfold through the eyes of a very normal human trying to figure it all out – just like us.

In this series, we want to affirm that faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows. We want to affirm that wandering is exploration, not necessarily distance from God. We want to affirm the ways Peter keeps going: he drops his nets, he walks on water, he runs to the empty tomb, he swims to the shore to meet the risen Christ. He keeps searching and yearning, and loving, even after missteps or mistakes. Ultimately, in Peter's story, we are reminded that God loves imperfect people – in fact, time and again, that's precisely who God claims and calls.

And that is what the whole season of Lent is about...recognizing our imperfectness, turning our lives to God, and being ready to be claimed and loved, becoming a disciple for Christ. Pastor Patti

Prayer: Engaging God, who is not afraid of any conversation, give me the words, wisdom and heart to join in difficult conversations. Amen.


REFOCUS FOR LENT


