PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR PATTI

Greetings and Grace to you all.

In this season of Lent, we are in a time of transformation...a spiritual transformation...which begins with entry into the wilderness as we are marked with ashes. We *depart* the routines and commonness of our lives and spend some time in the wilderness (40 days actually) as we *encounter* God in ways that we hope can transform our hearts and minds. And then we re-enter (or *return*) to our lives in a new way.

Richard Rohr, an American Franciscan priest and writer on spirituality, posted a daily meditation on "*The Center for Action and Contemplation.*" It describes this time in our lives as a "Hero's Journey." Richard says, "forces of good and evil are always in play, leading to tragedies and graces in our lives."

This journey is about leaving what's comfortable, what feels like sufficient and enough...to discover a bigger world...bigger than here. That's called *departure*. In the *Wizard of Oz*, Dorothy has to leave Kansas – and she's taken away by a tornado. And, like Dorothy, it will take a circumstance, an accident, a death or suffering of some kind for us to leave the comforts of our lives. But in this journey, we have to lose or walk away from our sense of order and enter some kind of disorder to experience transformation.

Then there's the *encounter*. After we leave our castle or stable home, we have to experience something bigger, something better, something that is more real and more demanding of our real energies. It's in our wilderness encounter, like when Jesus went into the desert for 40 days, that we find what's real in this journey.

Surprisingly, the third stage of our journey is the *return*. We can't spend the rest of our lives in the wilderness. We have to return to where we started, know it in a new way, and experience life in a new way. We are not somehow "beyond" the order and disorder of our lives; we've learned how to integrate both of them.

We *depart*, to experience an *encounter*, which hopefully causes a transformation of our hearts and our minds so we can *return* to our lives in a new way.

Our focus in scripture for midweek worship will be from the Synod's "Go and … for Lent" series. We continue to explore stories and have conversations around them on Wednesday evenings.

- March 6: Jesus' story about the Good Samaritan
- March 13: Observations from the Temple – Turning Over the Tables and/or Giving 2 Coins
- March 20: The Road to Emmaus

Holy Week begins on March 24 with Palm/Passion Sunday.

March 28: Maundy Thursday with Communion

March 29: Good Friday "Prayer Stations of Peter"

March 31: Easter Sunday with Communion – Pastor Patti
